World-leading scientist experiences Oil Search's HIV programs in PNG first-hand

Friday 31st May 2014 (Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea) – Papua New Guinea (PNG) is one of the countries most affected by HIV in the Asia-Pacific Region. Current estimates suggest that HIV prevalence in PNG is 0.5% of people aged 15-49 years of age, and that there are 25,000 people living with HIV.

Access to HIV prevention, testing, treatment and care services is particularly challenging in remote areas of the country, where the environment and location can make access to health facilities very difficult. Innovative processes and partnerships for providing HIV and other health services in PNG, such as those offered by Oil Search, have been important elements in the country's HIV response. Case studies from PNG and other countries in the Asia-Pacific Region will be a major focus of attention at the 20th International AIDS Conference (AIDS 2014) taking place in Melbourne, Australia, from 20th – 25th July.

This week, Professor Sharon Lewin, local co-chair of AIDS 2014, will join a field trip to Tari Hospital hosted by Oil Search, to experience first-hand how private sector companies are leveraging their business systems and local knowledge to implement and scale-up HIV prevention, testing, counselling and treatment services in remote and rural regions of PNG. Professor Lewin is one of the world's leading scientists researching a potential cure for HIV.

"I am very excited that private companies such as Oil Search are involved in AIDS 2014 in such a significant way," said Lewin. "This level of support reflects the depth of commitment Oil Search has shown in Papua New Guinea and new models of HIV-related programs based on very successful public-private partnerships. I am eager to see first-hand the wonderful work Oil Search, the National Department of Health and the Global Fund are doing with local communities to halt the progress of HIV."

The delegation, made up of representatives from Oil Search, Oil Search Health Foundation, UNAIDS, the Global Fund, National Department of Health and other organisations will explore how public-private partnerships are being developed to respond to HIV. The Oil Search Health Foundation, which works in close partnership with the PNG Government, is a sub-recipient of the Global Fund Round 10 HIV grant in the Hela and Morobe provinces.

Delegates will visit Tari Hospital in Hela province to witness how the Oil Search Health Foundation HIV team is supporting the HIV clinic at the hospital. They will also visit a number of local health facilities nearby to talk to staff and frontline health workers about the challenges they face and impact they are having on the HIV response in Hela.

Peter Botten, Managing Director for Oil Search, will be accompanying the high-level delegation to demonstrate how Oil Search's infrastructure, business skills and financial resources are helping to step up the pace in Papua New Guinea's HIV response.

"Hela Province is the heartland of our operating area, but also one of the places that has a significant HIV burden. Visiting Tari Hospital is a powerful and confronting experience. Only by being there can you really appreciate the challenging environment in which the hospital and health facilities are struggling to provide quality HIV services," said Botten.

"For us, it is an environment we deal with every day, so we are well accustomed to handling the challenges of remote and rural settings," he said.

"I believe strongly that there is an obligation on the private sector to leverage its skills and expertise to support overburdened and fragile health systems and urge others operating in similar environments, both in PNG and elsewhere in the region, to work with local partners to develop meaningful health interventions where they are so desperately needed."
